June Worship Themes

June 2: "Vessels of Christ"

- Traci Rabenstein

Scripture Texts: Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

June 9: "Water from the Well" - Jim Benedict

Worship Theme: Sometimes we have to dig a little deeper to realize just how blessed we are.

Scripture Text: Isaiah 12

June 16: "Seed, Scattered and Sown" - Jim Benedict

Worship Theme: To be a person of faith is like being a farmer in the sense that we are called to act without any guarantee that our actions will lead directly to the outcomes we hope for. We plant seed and trust God.

Scripture Text: Mark 4:26-34

June 23: "Treasure in Clay Jars" - Jim Benedict

Worship Theme: If you had something extremely valuable, where would you keep it? Paul claimed God had chosen to put "treasure in clay jars." We are both fragile and precious to God.

Scripture Text: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

June 30: "Do You Believe in Magic?" - Jim Benedict

Worship Theme: The power that Jesus had, and which we also have when we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, isn't magic. It is the power of love.

Scripture Text: Mark 5:21-34

Reading Season

Jesus told the crowds all these things in parables; without a parable he told them nothing. This was to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet:

"I will open my mouth to speak in parables; I will proclaim what has been hidden since the foundation [of the world]." Matthew 13:34-35

Sometimes, to tell the truth you have to tell a story. In fact, it is through stories that we have all come to know the truth about God through Jesus. Each of the four gospels describes Jesus in a different way, but each of them is a story. And Jesus himself used stories (called parables) to communicate the truth he had to share.

No mere list of facts can accomplish what a story can. Facts have to be carefully gathered, double-checked, and put into context before we can even begin to get a hint of what they mean or whether they are relevant to the fundamental questions we face: Who are we? Where do we come from and where are we going? Do we have a purpose, and if so, what is it?

Stories, on the other hand, can address our concerns directly even if they are entirely fiction. The parables are a good example. The validity of the story of the Good Samaritan does not depend on us finding archeological evidence of a particular Samaritan behaving in the way described. The validity of the story lies in Jesus' telling of it and its ability to describe human behavior we can recognize and with which we can identify.

For many of us, summer is a time when we do a bit more reading, either at the beach, in a cabin in the mountains, or at home. Much of that reading is fiction. Romances and thrillers are popular genres. But there are also works of fiction that help us consider the big questions, and if you plan to do some reading this summer (or any time of year), I encourage you to consider some of it. You can start with one or more of the gospels themselves. You might also consider some of the classics, like *Paradise Lost, The Pilgrim's Progress*, or *The Narnia Chronicles*. You can also check out C. S. Lewis' parable of heaven and hell, *The Great Divorce*.

There are no doubt plenty of other good books for you to read, and certainly many others who could provide better recommendations. I simply want to give you encouragement to immerse yourself in stories, because stories can (and sometimes do) tell the truth that we can't get at any other way.



"Witness to the Host City"






Dive into VBS like Never Before!


